usculoskeletal disorders (MSDs), such as chronic back pain or shoulder problems, often take time to develop. Forceful exertion, awkward positions, hand-arm and whole-body vibration, contact stress, and repetitive tasks can add up over time to produce an MSD.

A new guide from the Infrastructure Health

& Safety Association (IHSA) can help pipe trade workers (plumbers and steamfitters) in the ICI sector identify musculoskeletal hazards in their job, and learn how to control them.

Bank of Montreal Poll: 63% Fear Recession, 48% Expect Economic Decline

s tariff threats loom, a new Bank of Montreal survey finds 63 per cent of Canadians expressed concerns about the potential for a recession in the next 12 months. The online poll also found 48 per cent of those surveyed believed the economy will weaken over the next year, while 19 per cent expect it to improve.

Rising prices and the cost of living continue to be top concerns for Canadians, the survey said.

More than two-thirds of respondents said inflation is having a negative impact on

their current financial situation. According to the survey 44 per cent of respondents said they were spending an extra \$100 to \$300 per month on basic living expenses, while 38 per cent reported spending more than \$300 extra every month. Additionally, 61 per cent of Canadian respondents said inflation is currently high and they fear prices will continue to rise.

The online survey of 1,500 adult Canadians was conducted by Pollara from November 8 to 18, 2024.
